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"I have been refused the right to have a representative of my choice. I understand that I am being ordered to make a report or answer questions and that, if I do not comply with the order, I may be disciplined for insubordination.

Therefore, I have no alternative but to abide by the order. However, by so doing, I do not waive my constitutional rights to remain silent under the 5th and 14th amendments to the United States Constitution and under the protections afforded me under state law."

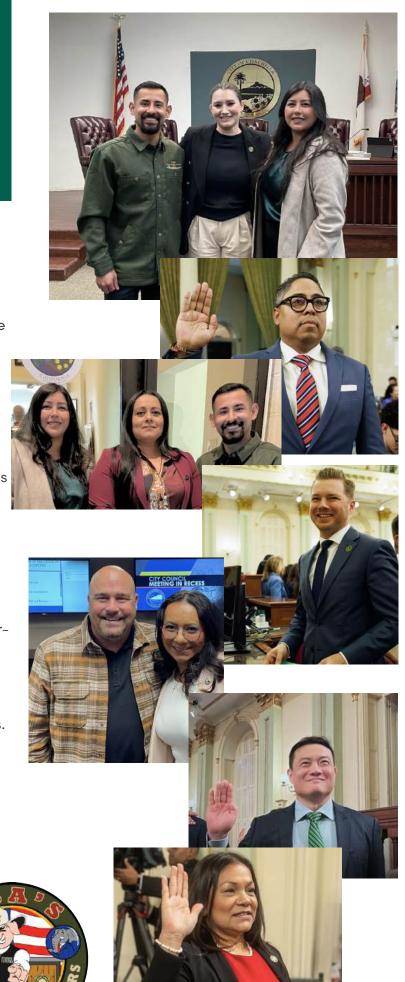

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# REMEMBERING DAYKA

**END OF WATCH: OCTOBER 29, 2024**

etired Sheriff's Service Dog Dayka passed away on October 29th, 2024. Dayka had been battling a lung cancer diagnosis since early May.

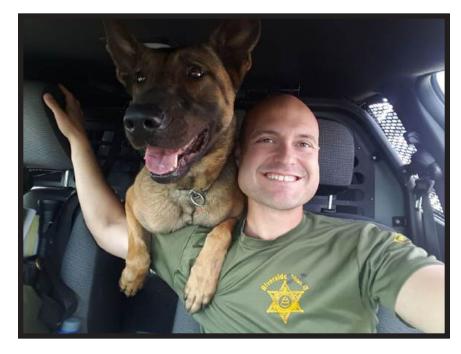
Dayka started her career in the Sheriff's Department when she was hand selected in Eindhoven Holland to be a patrol K9 to serve the Temecula City contract in 2016. Dayka worked with Deputy Matthew Cramer for the Temecula Sheriff's Station and the Special Enforcement Bureau until she retired from service in 2020.

Dayka's original trainer from Holland, Christa Trouw, remained in contact with Deputy Cramer and travelled to the United States several times to see Dayka compete in K9 trials and attend ride-a-longs to see Dayka perform in the field.

Dayka was quite an asset to the department, assisting with the apprehension of hundreds of felony suspects and the location of hundreds of pounds of narcotics. She received numerous awards for her performance including the Murrieta K9 Trials Top Dog award in 2020 and the TIP Top Cop award in 2019.

The City of Temecula also loved Dayka, as she frequently attended city functions and even took part in a city-wide scavenger hunt over several weeks where members of the community hunted for stuffed Dayka dolls hidden throughout the city and shared on social media.

Dayka lived out her retirement with retired Sheriff's Service Dogs Rudy and Raven and travelled all over the United States jumping into every lake, stream, and puddle she could find.





# REMEMBERING DAYKA

END OF WATCH: OCTOBER 29, 2024



After developing a life threatening illness in 2017, Dayka received an unprecedented level care from the City of Temecula, VCA El Rancho Animal Hospital, and California Veterinary Services Murrieta. The treatment she received allowed her to recover and continue working for several years, and ultimately prolonged her life in retirement.

In retirement, the Riverside Sheriff's K9 Association in conjunction with the Deputy Relief Foundation helped to fund Dayka's medical insurance which allowed her level of medical care to continue until her condition worsened in October.

Deputy Cramer and K9 Dayka were always very thankful for the support of the Riverside Sheriff's Department, the community, and the associations that work so hard on their behalf.

## A Successful Year Comes To A Close

ooking back on 2024, it's clear that the RSA racked up an un-



precedented number of victories for its members and experienced an extremely successful year.

Among the highlights:

- Adoption of a new and improved multiyear MOU
- Election of most of our endorsed candidates
- Passage of Prop 36 with over 68% of the vote
- Defeat of nearly all of the bad bills introduced in Sacramento

#### **MOU ADOPTION**

Last month in this publication, RSA President Bill Young provided a summary of the new MOU for both the Corrections and Law Enforcement Bargaining Units. As President Young stated, "Both units will see pay increases across the board, along with enhancements to working conditions that we believe will make a real difference in your day-to-day experiences on the job." This MOU is a huge win for RSA members and for public safety throughout Riverside County.

### **ELECTIONS HAVE CONSEQUENCES**

Passage of Prop. 36 and "making crime illegal again" by repealing the most egregious pro-criminal policies enacted a decade ago by Prop 47.

This MOU is a huge win for RSA members and for public safety throughout Riverside County.

Voters also rejected Proposition 6 which sought to prevent county jails and prisons from requiring inmates to work.

The association was also successful in helping to elect dozens of pro-law enforcement candidates throughout the state, including those for school board, city council, mayor, county supervisor, state assembly, state senate and Congress.

The 2024 elections once again demonstrate why the RSA remains the most sought-after political endorsement in the county. We strongly advocate for and support the candidacies of those who seek to improve public safety while protecting the rights and benefits of our dedicated members who protect and defend our communities throughout the county.

Nearly one-third of the legislature will be experiencing their first term in Sacramento as a state lawmaker. This will provide us with an important opportunity to educate them about our perspective regarding the public safety and law enforcement issues they will be considering this session. Sharing information and developing relationships with these new members will be the key to our continued success going forward.

### CRAZY BILLS DEFEATED IN 2023-2024 SESSION

Throughout the 2023-2024 legislative session, the RSA developed and maintained a powerful and effective coalition with other law enforcement and public safety groups and stayed in close communication with members of the legislature and their staffs. The results were better than we had hoped for and led to the defeat of myriad anti-cop and pro-criminal proposals, including those that would have:

- Banned the use of police K9s for arrest or apprehension;
- Allowed parole for cop-killers;
- Prohibited routine traffic stops for moving and other violations;
- Allowed the public to file knowingly false complaints against police officers;
- Codified inmates' "right" to visits, regardless of behavior or criminal acts of visitors;
- Legalized ecstasy, ayahuasca mushrooms and mescaline for therapy;

#### **LEGISLATIVE CORNER**

- Authorized "recreational use" of DMT, mescaline & magic mushrooms;
- Required officers to issue Miranda-type warnings to witnesses prior to questioning;
- Eliminated mandated reporting of violent acts and narcotic sales on school campuses;
- Eliminated mandated reporting by medical staff of serious domestic violence injuries;
- Required gun owners (& cops) to pay an annual firearms safety fee for each firearm;
- Stop schools from suspending or expelling pupils who bring fentanyl, etc on campus;
- Banned the use of presumptive "colormetric" field tests of a controlled substance;
- Required all gun owners and cops to have firearm insurance;
- Permit county supervisors to unilaterally remove an elected sheriff from office;
- Prohibited using any local control education funds for school resource officers;
- Allowed all violent felons to seek resentencing if they claim they had ever been a victim of human trafficking, sexual abuse or domestic violence;
- Required confidential (nonlawyer) jail phone calls/visits to all inmates each month;
- Diverted 95% juvenile justice funds from probation to community-based organizations:
- Prohibit peace officers from purchasing off-roster firearms;
- Reduced the minimum fine related to possession of controlled substances;
- Restricted retention of automated license plate reader data to 30 or 60 days;
- Banned the use of facialrecognition technology with body-worn cameras;

- Prohibited solitary confinement for repeat, deadly offenders in prison or jail;
- Allowed criminals injured by police while resisting arrest to get victim compensation;
- Prohibited citations and the use of handcuffs on school grounds;
- Banned consensual searches by law enforcement;
- Reduced sentences for convicted murderers;
- Allowed courts to recall, resentence and release dangerous inmates - anytime;
- Provided additional sentence reductions for those convicted of violent gun crimes;
- Allows participants in a crime to qualify for crime victims compensation fund dollars;
- Codified new ways for violent offenders to get early prison release;
- Banned the booting or towing of illegally parked vehicles.

As you can see, legislators, including many who wrote the bills defeated above, unfortunately appear to be detached from the realities in which their constituents live.

Is it possible that the legislators who supported these dangerous bills missed the nightly news programs over the last couple years showing mobs of criminals and brazen individuals raiding local businesses without fear of consequence?

Or maybe these same lawmakers simply view the thousands of fentanyl poisoning deaths in our state as a symptom of failed drug policies and that decriminalizing illicit drug use would somehow make these drugs safer for users and society as a whole?

While the RSA leadership remains supportive of common-sense efforts to help lift people out of poverty and escape the perils of addiction, we remain steadfast in our resolution to protect the public by combatting misguided and harmful legislative proposals that endanger us all.



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These are the types of bills we must continually be prepared to take on. While the voters have made it clear that they want the soft-on-crime policies to end, it is expected that during the 2025-2026 legislative session, more than a few state legislators will seek to push back against the current "propublic safety" attitude of the electorate.

Your RSA leaders have given clear direction that in 2025, we will continue leading the fight in Sacramento to protect you, your rights and your family's safety.

## **Notice To Employees**

## Injuries Caused By Work

he California Labor Code §3550 mandates that the employer shall post information to all the California employees notices as to the rights and benefits that the injured worker has if they have an injury or become ill because of the job in a conspicuous location that is frequented by the employees.

notice sets forth the information for the worker and states "don't delay". It indicates that there are time limits, and if you wait too long you may lose your rights to benefits.

You need to report your injury immediately

to your supervisor, or the employer. The

#### **AB1870**

Recently covered in the LAW1199 2024, Issue #5, there was review of the new law AB1870 that states that the employer is to notify by the posting that the worker may consult a licensed attorney to advise you of your rights under workers' compensation laws. In most instances the attorney fees will be paid from your "recovery."

The notice that the state has created which is called Notice to Employees—Injuries Caused By Work, is information that covers the types of injuries that have occurred, and do occur, in the work situation such as a specific injury or a cumulative trauma injury. The notice also educates the worker of the medical care which incorporates the doctor visits, hospital care, physical therapy, laboratory test, x-rays, medications, possible medical equipment and travel. In that document where it talks about medical care there is a very strong statement; "you should never see a bill".

#### **MEDICAL CARE**

That outlines that the employer is responsible for the cost of the medical care. The medical care initially is emergency care, such as if you need immediate medical help. The medical care can be hospitalization, ambulance, and fire or police departments providing assistance to you. You need to report your injury immediately to your supervisor, or the employer. The notice sets forth the information for the worker and states "don't delay". It indicates that there are time limits, and if you wait too long you may lose your rights to benefits. It also states your employer is required to provide you the claim form within one working day after learning about your injury. Within one working day after you file your claim form, your employer or claims administrator must authorize the provision of all treatment, up to ten thousand dollars, consistent with the applicable treatment guidelines, for

your alleged injury until the claim is accepted or rejected.

The notice that is posted also states your primary treating physician is the one that has the primary responsibility for treating of your injury. It outlines the opportunity for predesignation of your personal physician or a medical group. If you do not do that designation and the employer has a medical provider network group or healthcare organization you then will be placed into those facilities for care.

## YOU MAY CONSULT AN ATTORNEY

A major change that occurred recently that is discussed in the 2024, Issue #5, is the mandate that the Notice To Employees – Injuries Caused By Work states; "you may consult a licensed attorney to advise you of your rights under workers' compensation laws, and in most instances attorney fees will be paid from your recovery".



#### **YOUR RIGHTS**

The Notice to the Employees—Injuries Caused By Work, is also a good training point for the Associations and/or Unions to train new workers, new members and go back and reeducate the current members as to their ability to receive care to cure or relieve the effects of the injury. The timeliness of reporting the injury is a major issue.

As stated before, the benefits under workers' compensation is the medical care to cure or relieve the effects of the injury. The second is temporary disability, or in certain law enforcement groups, benefits pursuant to Labor Code \$4850 or \$4800.5 if you lose wages while recovering. It states:

In the notice to the employee that is posted the temporary disability benefits (§4800.5 and §4850) may not be paid for more than 104 weeks within five years from the date of injury with some very minor exceptions.

The permanent disability is that recovery that you receive if the job-related injury causes permanent loss of physical or mental function that is measureable by a doctor. There are job displacement benefits if the injury is on after

01/01/2004 and the employer does not offer you a regular modified or alternate work.

At the bottom of the Notice to the Employees—Injuries Caused By Work that is required to be posted, there is also a very significant statement that informs the worker. Pursuant to Labor Code §132(a) it states:

Discrimination. It is illegal for your employer to punish or fire you for having a work injury or illness, for filing a claim, or testifying in another person's workers' compensation case. If proven, you may receive lost wages, job reinstatement, increased benefits, and costs and expenses up to limits set by the state.

The violation of Labor Code §132(a) continues and if the employer, supervisor or other individual engages in this

#### Notice to Employees-Injuries Caused By Work

You may be entitled to workers' compensation benefits if you are injured or become ill because of your job. Workers' compensation covers most work-related physical or mental injuries and illnesses. An injury or illness can be caused by one event (such as hurting your back in a fall) or by repeated exposures (such as hurting your wrist from doing the same motion over and over).

#### Benefits. Workers' compensation benefits include:

- Medical Care: Doctor visits, hospital services, physical therapy, lab tests, x-rays, medicines, medical equipment and travel costs that
  are reasonably necessary to treat your injury. You should never see a bill. There are limits on chiropractic, physical therapy and
  occupational therapy visits.
- Temporary Disability (TD) Benefits: Payments if you lose wages while recovering. For most injuries, TD benefits may not be
  paid for more than 104 weeks within five years from the date of injury.
- Permanent Disability (PD) Benefits: Payments if you do not recover completely and your injury causes a permanent loss of physical or mental function that a doctor can measure.
- Supplemental Job Displacement Benefit: A nontransferable voucher, if you are injured on or after 1/1/2004, your injury causes
  permanent disability, and your employer does not offer you regular, modified, or alternative work.
- Death Benefits: Paid to your dependents if you die from a work-related injury or illness.

Naming Your Own Physician Before Injury or Illness (Predesignation). You may be able to choose the doctor who will treat you for a job injury or illness. If eligible, you must tell your employer, in writing, the name and address of your personal physician or medical group before you are injured. You must obtain their agreement to treat you for your work injury. For instructions, see the written information about workers' compensation that your employer is required to give to new employees.

#### If You Get Hurt

- Get Medical Care. If you need emergency care, call 911 for help immediately from the hospital, ambulance, fire department or
  police department. If you need first aid, contact your employer.
- 2. Report Your Injury. Report the injury immediately to your supervisor or to an employer representative. Don't delay. There are time limits. If you wait too long, you may lose your right to benefits. Your employer is required to provide you with a claim form within one working day after learning about your injury. Within one working day after you file a claim form, your employer or claims administrator must authorize the provision of all treatment, up to ten thousand dollars, consistent with the applicable treatment guidelines, for your alleged injury until the claim is accepted or rejected.
- 3. See Your Primary Treating Physician (PTP). This is the doctor with overall responsibility for treating your injury or illness.
  - If you predesignated your personal physician or a medical group, you may see your personal physician or the medical group after you are injured.
  - If your employer is using a medical provider network (MPN) or a health care organization (HCO), in most cases you will be
    treated within the MPN or HCO unless you predesignated a personal physician or medical group. An MPN is a group of
    physicians and health care providers who provide treatment to workers injured on the job. You should receive information
    from your employer if you are covered by an HCO or a MPN. Contact your employer for more information.
  - If your employer is not using an MPN or HCO, in most cases the claims administrator can choose the doctor who first treats
    you when you are injured, unless you predesignated a personal physician or medical group.
- You may consult a licensed attorney to advise you of your rights under workers' compensation laws. In most instances, attorney's fees will be paid from your recovery.
- 5. Medical Provider Networks. Your employer may be using an MPN, which is a group of health care providers designated to provide treatment to workers injured on the job. If you have predesignated a personal physician or medical group prior to your work injury, then you may go there to receive treatment from your predesignated doctor. If you are treating with a non-MPN doctor for an existing injury, you may be required to change to a doctor within the MPN. For more information, see the MPN contact information below:

If proven, you may receive lost wages, job reinstatement, increased benefits, and costs and expresses up to limits set but he state.

Questions? Learn more about workers' compensation by reading the information that your employer is required to give you at time of hire. If you have questions, see your employer or the claims administrator (who handles workers' compensation claims for your

conduct, is made aware that it is illegal to do this, they then can re-evaluate and use a different template so they are not discriminating against the worker.

Again, the information and the Notice to the Employees—Injuries Caused By Work, is something that needs to be not just posted, but classes offered by the Employees Association or Union to the members that goes into greater depth and detail. The changes that have occurred regarding the notice and consulting a licensed attorney are significant. More importantly, is the workers ability to recognize that the predesignation of a doctor prior to the job-related injury and using the proper form, this allows them to go to a group or doctor that is outside of the realm of control of the employer's medical group. \*

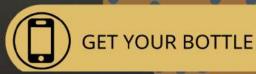

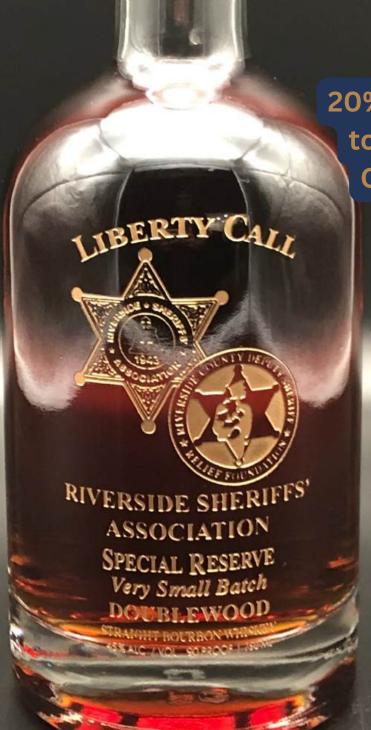
