Deputy Timothy Corlew was killed in a collission on the 91 Freeway involving his patrol motorcycle on January 8. The RSA extends its deepest sympathies to the Corlew family.

Deputy Corlew started his Riverside County career in 2016 as a bailiff. He transferred to patrol operations at the Jurupa Valley Station in 2019. He deployed as a motorcycle patrolman in 2022.

A remembrance service attended by hundreds of law enforcement, family, and friends, was held in Riverside at Harvest Christian Church.

Timothy is survived by his wife, Mercedes, two sons, Kasey & Riley, father, mother, two brothers and sister.

The Return Of The Legislators



As the new year kicks off, its plain to see that things have changed quite a bit in Sacramento.

nlike the past 10 years, few of the bills introduced in 2025



appear to be targeting law enforcement or seeking to provide greater benefits and/or reduced penalties for criminal offenders. As of this writing, less than 700 of the expected 2000+ bills have made it to print, so we'll have to wait and see.

Unlike the past 10 years, few of the bills introduced in 2025 appear to be targeting law enforcement or seeking to provide greater benefits and/or reduced penalties for criminal offenders.

OF BUDGETS & WILDFIRES

Just over a month ago, the state announced that the upcoming 2025-2026 state budget would be relatively flat, but the wildfires across the southern part has torn a multi-billion dollar hole into the previously "balanced" budget. The legislature moved quickly to ensure immediate funding was provided to help those most impacted by the deadly and devastating fires. Additional state funding is expected to flow as the lengthy and costly clean up a d rebuilding efforts commence.

Most lawmakers understand that the majority of new legislative proposals with significant costs attached to them will not survive the committee or budget processes.

SOME BILLS OF CONCERN

For example, one lawmaker introduced a bill to increase pay for jail and prison inmates while another concluded that 2025 was the right year to cap and reduce the salaries and benefits of first responders and other public servants - while enjoying the pay and perks that accompany his title of "state assembly member."

An amendment to the state's constitution was recently introduced by a different assembly member seeming to overturn a voter-enacted initiative that has prohibited state lawmakers from receiving a taxpayer-funded public pension since 1990.

RUMOR MILL - WHAT WE'RE HEARING

Some of the more controversial bills from the last few sessions are expected to be re-introduced before the mid-February deadline. Some of the failed legislative proposals from the past that may return in 2025 include:

- Permitting "magic mushrooms" and other hallucinogenics
- Removing mandated reporting in schools and hospitals
- Allowing early prison release for first degree murderers.



- Reducing officer safety by banning certain robotic devices
- Additional firearm restrictions on peace officers
- Making "free syringes for drug users" law permanent

Relatedly, some good bills that died over the last few years may also be given another chance at passage. These include:

- Restricting the sale of xylazine (tranq)
- Classifying felony domestic violence as a violent crime
- Regulating intoxicating hemp and kratom products
- Enhanced penalty for interfering with firefighter aircraft
- Prohibiting the sale of Tianeptine (gas station heroin)
- Increasing penalties for selling fentanyl to kids
- Designating rape of disabled child as a violent crime
- Increasing penalties for some arson crimes

and since 2016 has served as a deputy attorney general at the California Department of Justice.

Democrat Jesse Arreguin, representing Senate District #7, was appointed as chair of the Public Safety Committee for the upper house. The freshman senator served as a city councilman from 2009 to 2016, when he was elected mayor. He remained Mayor for the last eight years until his election to the state senate last November.

A Big WIN For RSA Members And The Fraternal Order Of Police

he Social Security Fairness
Act (H.R. 82) passed both
chambers of Congress and was
recently signed into law on January 5,
2025. The Social Security Fairness Act
sought to boost social security benefits
for millions of public service workers; including, eligible public safety members.



In short, the Social Security Fairness Act repeals two federal policies, the Windfall Elimination Provision (WEP) and the Government Pension Offset (GOP), both of which previously limited benefits for otherwise deserving members. The WEP and GOP reduced social security benefits for members if they receive pensions from employment not covered by social security.

The significant efforts of the Fraternal Order of Police, in conjunction with nationwide assistance and support from other public sector unions aimed to "right" the "wrong" of

paying into a system only to be shut out of that very benefit system. The Fraternal Order of Police approach was rooted in a commonsense approach of fairness. Simply stated, if your hard-earned money is paid into social security you should be able to access it when you retire. Nothing more, nothing less.

Eligibility for retirement benefits requires a member to have paid into Social Security for at least 40 quarters (10 years.) In addition, the Social Security Fairness Act is retroactively effective for benefits paid after December 2023. Egg Roll Bowl



Cook Time: 20 Minutes Prep: 10 Minutes





Serves: 2-4

Ingredients:

- **Ground Turkey;** Can use ground chicken, beef, or pork as well
- Cabbage; one medium head thinly shredded. To add color you can do a variety of green and purple
- Carrots; Thinly shredded whole carrots
- Onion; Sweet onion is preferred, but can be substitued for Red or Yellow
- Ginger & Garlic; Fresh ginger & garlic are best. Pre-peel the garlic for easier prep. Ginger paste can be used
- Soy Sauce; liquid coco aminos work as a good subsitute as well
- Rice Vinegar
- Sesame Oil

Instructions:

- Step 1: Slice the cabbage thinly (around ¼ to ½ inch thick) using a sharp knife for even cooking. If you're starting with whole carrots, shred them using a cheese grater or a food processor unless you already have matchstick-cut carrots on hand.
- Step 2: Heat a large skillet over medium to medium-high heat and add the ground meat. Cook for about 5-6 minutes, breaking it apart into small pieces as it cooks. (Pro tip: A potato masher works great for this!) Cook until the meat is nearly done.
- Step 3: Push the meat to one side of the skillet, then add the diced onion and a tablespoon of oil to the other side. Sauté the onion for 3-4 minutes until softened. Stir in the shredded carrots, minced garlic, and grated ginger, and cook for another 2 minutes. Combine the vegetables with the meat, then pour in the chicken broth, scraping the bottom of the pan to deglaze it.
- Step 4: Add the cabbage along with soy sauce, vinegar, salt, and pepper. Stir everything thoroughly, ensuring the cabbage is evenly coated. Cover the skillet with a lid.
- Step 5: Reduce the heat to medium-low and let the mixture cook for 12-15 minutes, or until the cabbage reaches your preferred level of tenderness. Just before serving, stir in toasted sesame oil for added flavor.
- Step 6: Garnish with green onions and toasted sesame seeds. For an optional spicy twist, sprinkle on red pepper flakes. Serve on its own or over your choice of white rice, brown rice, or cauliflower rice. Enjoy!

Can Medication For Hypertension Be A Factor In Causing Cancer?

he International Agency for Research on Cancer, otherwise known as "IARC", is a part of the World Health Organization (WHO). This agency, IARC, was established to garner information from various entities and combine those findings as to the risk and causes of cancer.

The IARC seeks out information as to the various types of cancers and what factors of life, or exposures in life, can be a developmental factor in the cause of human cancer.

The IARC identifies various elements that are carcinogens or elements of carcinogens that cause cancer. These elements or a combination of those can be a substantial factor in the manifestation and development of cancer.

California workers compensation has a cancer presumption for active firefighters and peace officers which The California worker also must be aware that certain medications for blood pressure can be a factor in the development of certain types of cancer.

is stated in Labor Code §3212.1. The Labor Code specifically defines cancers that can be job based upon the showing of proof of certain types of exposures to known carcinogens. A carcinogen known are defined by the International Agency for Research on Cancer (IARC). There are publications in *A Newsletter* that has been presented by IARC, the most recent dated December 20, 2024, issue #10 found

that certain medications that are taken by patients for hypertension, peripheral edema, or other medication which is utilized to minimize certain fungal or yeast infections, are a carcinogen.

Additional medications that are used to treat risk for additional problems such as cell organ transplant, treating dermatitis and as stated controlling the level of blood pressure. These medications are now classified as a Carcinogen Group 1. The evidence reviewed that these types of medications can be a factor if the manifestation and/or development such as squamous cell carcinoma, cancer of the lips, basal cell carcinoma and skin. These findings as a Carcinogen Group 1 expands the protections available out of Labor Code §3212.1.

This study reflects knowledge that the treating doctors must consider



when prescribing medications that may be a substantial factor in manifestation development of various cancers.

The California worker also must be aware that certain medications for blood pressure can be a factor in the development of certain types of cancer.

The medical care under the California system, whether it is for cancer or other conditions that are job-related, is to cure or relieve the effects of the injury. If in fact the worker is taking the medication for a job-related injury and it causes other medical problems, this becomes the responsibility of the workers' compensation system.

The continuation of expanding knowledge that we have as to the carcinogens and their impact allows some ability to various doctors to make a medical opinion as to the best approach to treat to cure or relieve the

effects of the injuries, or numerous other medical problems that could be an additional factor for the development of cancer.

As the worker is aware, medical care to cure or relieve the effects of the injury is paramount to getting better. At the same time the worker and the doctor needs to be aware of the risk factors that may evolve because of the types of treatment.

The World Health Organization continues to use studies which help all parties involved in making a better decision regarding medical care.

In the workers' compensation system the statute of limitations to file on the cancer case can be limited to no more than 120-months from the last day of work. That statement of 120-months is based upon the number of years that the worker has been employed. Even with that, 120-months, there are many exceptions that go way beyond that depending upon the period

of time from development of manifestation of the disease. The new finding of certain medications being a Carcinogen Group 1 requires knowledge on behalf of the treater and the individual seeking the medical care to cure and relieve the effects of the injury.

As new studies evolve we will have more information as to what may be the more accurate treatment, not only for cancer, but other medical treatment that may raise the likelihood of other cancers developing.

The International Agency for Research on Cancer (IARC) studies and findings are very important and a reliable source of information regarding the types of care and treatment the injured worker should receive. Additionally, the worker should go to www. webmd and look at the area that speaks of the risk of side effects of the medications that they are taking and inform if there are side effects to the treating doctor. *
