# Reflecting On Bravery And Sacrifice

### **State And National Peace Officer Memorials**

write to you during what is always a sad month for me, as it is when we remember our fallen with



ceremonies at the State and National Peace Officer Memorials. It has been a tough few months for our department, with three of our Deputies losing their lives in the line of duty. It is a time to reflect on the bravery and sacrifice of individuals like Isaiah Cordero, Darnell Calhoun, and Brett Harris, who gave their lives while serving to protect others. During this solemn month, as we gather for ceremonies at the State and National Peace Officer Memorials, it is important to recognize the enduring legacy of these brave individuals.

I was honored to represent the RSA Membership at the State and National Peace Officer Memorials. At the California ceremony where new names were enrolled on the monument, I sat with Deputy Cordero's family and listened to various speeches by both law enforcement officials and politicians. Those speeches were a mixture of honest truth and self-serving, dishonest blabber by those who pretended to care about you and your law enforcement brethren.

First, the honest truth was delivered by our Sheriff, who was the keynote speaker for this year's ceremony. Sheriff Bianco nailed his speech, saying loudly and clearly what every cop in the audience wanted to say to the politicians in attendance. As I sat listening to

the Sheriff, I watched the politicians squirm on stage as they had to listen to unvarnished truth being presented to them, a contrast to the vapid talking points on law enforcement and the criminal justice system the politicians usually spew.

The blabber came next, as the Governor and the State Attorney General spoke words that made it sound like they cared about law enforcement, a stark contrast to the reality reflected daily by their actions and the crazy policies they support. I doubt a single law enforcement officer in attendance, or the families of those whose names were inscribed or to be inscribed on the memorial wall, believed a word those politicians spoke. I know I didn't, and it was difficult to sit with the families of the fallen and listen to two people

whose policies ultimately played a role in the death of their loved ones now claim they felt terrible for their loss. The memory of Isaiah, Darnell, and Brett, along with all the officers who have fallen in the line of duty, will always be honored and remembered for their selflessness and bravery. And rest assured, Sheriff Bianco made that clear when he spoke in Sacramento.

I pray somehow that the hardworking people of California wake up and see that these politicians are destroying lives and creating victims daily, criminal penalties are weakened, and dangerous people are freed early from custody and let loose on society. I also pray that some politicians will recognize the suffering they have created among innocent victims and prioritize the health and welfare of law-abiding citizens and brave peace officers throughout the State. However, as the following bills pending a floor vote after initial passage out of the Appropriations Committee demonstrate, the crazy rush to reward convicted criminals and punish the law-abiding continues unabated:

#### SACRAMENTO

The Senate and Assembly Appropriations Committees met recently for their final hearings to decide the outcome of all bills with fiscal impacts. In total, over a thousand bills were voted on during these two hearings, including many of our priorities. Most notably, AB 742 (ban on police K9s) was passed out of the Assembly Appropriations Committee but was amended to essentially define K9s as lethal force (i.e., only used to bite in instances where there is an immediate or imminent threat to death or serious bodily injury). Law enforcement labor unions are working closely with Chiefs and Sheriffs Associations. We remain strongly opposed to this new version,

which equates in many ways to a complete ban, and at the very least, dramatically eliminates the utility K9s play in de-escalating situations and protecting officers. Now the Assembly and Senate will vote on all the bills passed to the Floors of each House in the coming weeks.

#### PASSED APPROPRIATIONS -FLOOR VOTES PENDING

- AB 93 bans consent searches of vehicles and persons.
- AB 733 can't buy own firearm from dept, but soon-to-retire can.
- AB 742 canine bill: amended so dogs can bite only when deadly force is authorized.
- AB 994 mugshots must use arrestee preferred name (intended for trans, applies to all).

- AB 1028 no mandated reporting of DV by medical staff so pimps will let girls get care.
- AB 1310 retro-active sentence reduction for felons who used a firearm in their crimes.
- AB 1486 ARs deemed nonstandard issue, will require local political permission.
- SB 2 fewer places where ccw is permitted, including for retired, reserve officers.
- SB 50 no traffic stops for busted lights, expired reg, etc.
- SB 58 legalize magic mushrooms.
- SB 377 no off-roster firearm purchases by officers.
- SB 94 cop killers (all 1st degree murder w/special circumstance) release after 20 years.
- SB 252 CalPERS to divest from fossil fuels, potentially harming pension fund.

#### PASSED APPROPRIATIONS - FLOOR VOTE PENDING (JAILS SPECIFIC)

- AB 280 no solitary for violent, mentally ill inmates.
- AB 958 statutory right to jail visits for inmates & visitor; civil liability if denied.
- ACA 4 felon inmates to vote from jail/prison.
- SB 519 county "dept of corrections" to run jails, not Sheriff.

The plethora of pending bills unequivocally highlights the primary focus of our state legislature, which appears to be safeguarding criminals from apprehension and subsequent prosecution, diminishing the potential penalties they might face upon conviction, and securing the premature release of current inmates. Many of our California politicians demonstrate an exclusive concern for the well-being of offenders while neglecting the imperative task of ensuring the safety of you and your loved ones. Superficially acknowledging and paying lip service to the sacrifices made by those who have tragically lost their lives in the line of duty does not absolve them of this prevailing reality.

#### **UNSAFE HANDGUN ACT**

I recently read an article by David E. Mastagni and Taylor Davies-Mahaffey regarding a Federal Court decision that impacts law enforcement. On March 20, 2023, Central District Judge Cormac J. Carney issued a preliminary injunction in Boland v. Bonta barring enforcement of the

deceptively titled "California's Unsafe Handgun Act" (UHA), ruling that "Californians have the constitutional right to acquire and use state-of-the-art handguns to protect themselves." This ruling is of particular importance to California peace officers given the introduction of SB 377, which would eliminate the peace officer exemption from the UHA, thereby prohibiting officers from purchasing or selling the modern handguns they bear while on duty. Intuitively, peace officers should have access to the newest and safest equipment, including firearms.

On behalf of the Peace Officers Research Association of California (PORAC), David E. Mastagni assisted PORAC President Brian Marvel in submitting a declaration in support of the plaintiffs, which was cited repeatedly by the court in pointing out the hypocrisy of the state's rationale for the roster. The court explained: "The government cannot credibly argue that handguns without CLI, MDM, and microstamping features pose unacceptable public safety risks when virtually all handguns available on the Roster and sold in California today lack those features."

The court rejected the state's historical analogies, explaining that laws to ensure guns operate as advertised are not analogous to requiring the implementation of new safety features. "These regulations are having a devastating impact on Californians' ability to acquire and use new, stateof-the-art handguns," according to the court.

This ruling should moot the SB 377 elimination of the peace officer exemption to the UHA by allowing all Californians access to state-of-the-art handguns for self-defense. The preliminary injunction is set to go into effect in two weeks, so the state can appeal the ruling to the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals, which is particularly vital and affirmed PORAC's successful argument during the AB 392 debate that the state cannot impinge on officers' right to self-defense.





218 retiree range qualification course at the Ben Clark Training Center (BCTC). The purpose of this event was to provide an op-

portunity for the retired members (sworn, and correctional deputies who completed 830.1 training prior to retirement) to possess and maintain their "CCW" and "HR-218" qualified credentials - which allows them to lawfully and legally carry firearms within the state of California - as well as nation-wide [as governed by the HR-218 standards].

The next qualification course will be held on; Thursday, September 14, 2023, at the Ben Clark Training Center. The range hours for that day will be 10:00 A.M. until 2:00 P.M. The RSA Rollin' Smokehouse & Chow Shack will provide lunch and refreshments.



# Some Early Victories

Ithough law enforcement and public safety remain

under constant attack in our state's capital, we have experienced a number of surprising early legislative victories in 2023. Working closely with the other Sacramento-based law enforcement lobbyists, we have been able to defeat or amend a handful of anti-public safety and anti-cop bills introduced during the first few months of this current legislative session.

Each legislative session is two years, so bills that get listed as "dead" in the first year can almost always be brought back to life during the second year, resulting in their designation as "two year bills." Fortunately, most two year bills do not find success in the second year of the session either. However,

the "two-year" classification gives the author a chance to avoid acknowledging defeat and to work on potential amendments that may allow it to advance out of committee next January.

Many of the bills "defeated" this year were never voted upon by the policy committee members. When an author learns that the committee is unlikely to approve of their legislation, the author will frequently "pull the bill" from the committee hearing agenda in hopes of working to amend the bill or to avoid the embarrassment of being publicly rejected by their peers. However, if the bill is pulled from the final hearing in advance of the policy committee deadline (end of April), the bill automatically becomes a two-year bill.

Below are some bills we helped defeat this year and a couple that we got amended to make them much less harmful to law enforcement or public safety listed by bill number, author's name, party, and home county.





#### **BILLS DEFEATED**

## Armed robotic devices, unmanned aircraft - dead: two year bill

The first version of this bill made it a misdemeanor for a person to manufacture or modify an unmanned vehicle to be capable of inflicting deadly force upon a person. The bill was amended three times, replacing the misdemeanor with a fine for any person who knowingly manufactures, modifies, sells, transfers, or operates a robotic device or unmanned aircraft that is equipped or mounted with a weapon. The bill was pulled by the author. AB 79 Weber (D-San Diego)

#### Defunding probation departments - dead: two year bill

The bill would require no less than 95% of funds dedicated for "multi-

agency juvenile justice" programs to be distributed to community-based organizations and other public agencies or departments that are not law enforcement entities and prohibits this portion of the funds from being used for law enforcement activities or personnel. After failing to secure the votes needed for committee approval, the bill was pulled by the author. AB 702 Jackson (D-Riverside)

#### Law enforcement drone mandates dead: two year bill

Prohibits law enforcement use of unmanned aerial vehicles (drones) manufactured in The People's Republic of China. The requirements of the bill would have doubled, tripled or more the cost of purchasing, servicing and operating drones, since most drones in use are manufactured in China.

The bill requires law enforcement agencies to replace their existing, high

quality/high capability drones with less effective, more expensive drones which will reduce public safety by impairing law enforcement search and rescue and surveillance efforts. The bill passed the Assembly Privacy and Consumer Protection Committee (chaired by the author) but was unsuccessful in the Assembly Accountability and Administrative Review Committee. AB 740 Gabriel (D-Los Angeles)

#### Cities/counties police review boards dead: two year bill

Requires the governing body of each city and county to create an independent community-based commission on law enforcement officer practices and authorize each commission to conduct independent investigations of complaints against a police officer or sheriff alleging physical injury to a person,





including injuries resulting in a person's death. Author pulled the bill prior to vote. AB 797 Weber (D-San Diego)

#### Removal of sheriff by county supervisors: - dead: two year bill

Would empower elected county politicians to remove another elected county politician (sheriff) from office. The bill easily passed out of the Assembly Public Safety Committee (chaired by the author) but was held in the Assembly Local Government Committee where it failed to get enough votes for passage. AB 1090 Jones-Sawyer (D-Los Angeles)

#### Defund & restrict school resource/ police officers - dead: two year bill

Prohibits the use of "local control funding formula" dollars provided by the state to school districts to be used for school resource or school police officers. AB 1299 Jackson (D-Riverside)

## No reporting of student attacks on school staff - dead: two year bill

This is a repeat of a failed senate bill from last session made even worse. This bill removes misdemeanor liability for students who willfully disturb any public school or any public school meeting, regardless of where they are enrolled. The bill also repeals the mandated reporting laws for dangerous activities and laws that make it illegal to inhibit or impede a person from reporting the information to law enforcement. The bill would also prohibit notifying law enforcement when school staff are assaulted by a student or when students are caught dealing narcotics, including meth, heroin, and fentanyl. The bill was refused a hearing. AB 1323 Kalra (D-Santa Clara)

## Firearms insurance for all, including cops - dead: two year bill

Requires a person who owns a firearm to obtain and continuously maintain a homeowner, renter, or gun liability insurance policy specifically covering losses or damages resulting from the use of that firearm. No exemption for active, reserve or retired peace officers. The bill failed to secure the needed votes for passage and was held in committee. SB 8 Blakespear (D-San Diego)

#### Police can't respond to homeless/ mentally ill calls - dead: two year bill

This bill would require 911 or other service center calls for service relating to mental health or homelessness to be dispatched to either fire, EMS personnel, mental health personnel, or nonsworn unarmed police personnel and not to police officers. Type of calls where police would be prohibited from

responding include illegal camping, panhandling, drug or alcohol use, public urination or defecation, disturbing the peace, or obstructing a sidewalk or entryway. This bill was never set for a hearing. SB 402 Wahab (D-Alameda).

#### **BILLS AMENDED**

## Officer personnel records open to public - amended

When initially introduced, the bill would have allowed a law enforcement agency to make public their reasoning for terminating the employment of a peace officer - without ensuring the protection of the officer's due process rights. The author accepted amendments to the bill, clarifying that law enforcement agencies are permitted, but not required, to disclose when an officer is terminated for cause, but only after the due process rights of the officers are protected and the termination is sustained. SB 400 Wahab (D-Alameda)

#### No discipline for bringing narcotics on campus - amended

As introduced, the bill prohibited suspending or expelling a student for possessing, using, or being under the influence of a controlled substance, an alcoholic beverage, or an intoxicant of any kind or for possessing or using tobacco or nicotine products. The committee chair, Asm Al Muratsuchi (D-Torrance) raised concerns about student and staff safety and proposed some amendments to allow the bill to advance. As amended, the bill will allow, but no longer mandate, a student be suspended or expelled for possession or under the influence of intoxicants on campus. The bill also prohibits suspending or expelling a student for possessing tobacco/nicotine products. AB 599 Ward (D-San Diego) As another legislative deadline approaches this month that requires all bills to pass out of fiscal committees before the end of the month, there's frantic activity under the dome as lawmakers try to save their pet bills.

In the Senate and Assembly Appropriations Committee hearings, hundreds of bills are acted upon in mere minutes and the fate all of these bills will be decided by pre-determined votes of the committee members. It's not the most transparent of processes and it's not pretty - but it's extremely efficient and we'll keep fighting for you throughout it all.


