# SACRAMENTO

The Assembly and Senate are currently on break for Summer Recess. Before the legislature adjourned, law enforcement secured two significant wins, defeating AB 793 (ban on geofencing and reverse-location warrants) and AB 1463 (restrictions on ALPR). We expect these bills to be revisited next year but are glad we kept them from moving further in this session. Additionally, AB 355 (assault rifle training) passed the Senate Public Safety Committee and inches closer to the Governor's desk. The legislature returns on August 15, when they will have one more month in session. The significant focus for law enforcement will be stopping SB 50 (ban on lowlevel traffic stops) and SB 94 (parole for LWOP).

Stay safe out there and prioritize the well-being of both you and your partners to ensure a safe return home for everyone. **\***







# Summer Break 2023

# A Brief Summary Of Important Bills

**Ryan Sherman** Director, Government Affairs

he state legislature recessed for their monthlong summer

break and will return to the Capitol on August 14. At this point in the legislative year, bills that remain alive have passed out of their policy committees and await action in the Appropriations Committees of the Senate or Assembly. If approved after the lawmakers return, the bills will advance to the floor of that body and then return to their house of origin for final approval if amendments had been taken in the opposite house. Upon final adoption by the legislature, the bills are then sent to the governor for his signature or veto.

We've listed a brief summary of some of the more important bills we are working to amend or defeat when the legislature returns next month. The status of each bill, its location, and our position, along with some that were recently defeated, are also listed.

# **CRIME/INFORMATION**

AB 994 (Jackson) requires law enforcement agencies to falsely identify arrested suspects when posting their mugshots on social media by using whatever names are preferred by the suspects (Gavin Newsom, Mickey Mouse, etc.)

Status: Senate Appropriations - oppose

AB 1028 (McKinnor) eliminates mandated reporting for medical professionals of suspected acts of domestic violence.

Status: Senate Appropriations Committee - oppose

AB 1034 (Wilson) bans use of officerworn body camera or official or personal cell or camera images in conjunction with facial recognition technology. *Status: Senate Floor - oppose*  AB 1310 (McKinnor) allows sentence reduction for inmates convicted of using a firearm in commission of a crime.

Status: Senate Appropriations Committee - oppose

**SB 50 (Bradford)** seeks to reduce racial profiling of drivers by prohibiting law enforcement traffic stops based on a single non-working light, expired registration or obstructed windshield. We remain opposed to the bill based on the road safety and criminal apprehension benefits these traffic stops provide.

Status: Assembly Appropriations Committee - oppose

SB 14 (Grove) human trafficking of minors elevated to a serious "strike" felony. All five Democrats on the Assembly Public Safety Committee

rejected it, despite it receiving unanimous, bi-partisan approval in the Senate. The defeat created a media firestorm, forcing the committee to reconsider the bill the very next day. Four of the six democrats then switched their votes, passing the bill.

Status: Assembly Appropriations Committee - support

SB 94 (Cortese) allows parole for first degree murderers convicted with special circumstances and sentenced to LWOP after 25 years. Amended to remove parole eligibility for cop killers and mass murderers serving LWOP.

Status: Assembly Appropriations Committee - oppose

# FIREARMS/PEACE OFFICERS

SB 2 (Portantino) significantly expands the list of locations where a ccw holder is prohibited from lawfully carrying. Many peace officers are exempt from these restrictions (but not all). We continue to work with the author and sponsor to secure those exemptions.

Status: Assembly Appropriations Committee - oppose

SB 377 (Skinner) bans peace officers from purchasing off-roster firearms (and then transferring the firearm to someone else) by prohibiting all peace officers from being able to purchase off-roster firearms. Agencies will remain able to purchase off roster.

Status: Assembly Appropriations Committee - oppose

AB 355 (Alanis) authorizes peace officer cadets to be certified in the use of assault weapons as part of their law enforcement academy training.

Status: Senate Appropriations Committee - support



SB 2 (Portantino) significantly expands the list of locations where a ccw holder is prohibited from lawfully carrying. Many peace officers are exempt from these restrictions (but not all). We continue to work with the author and sponsor to secure those exemptions.

AB 733 (Fong) prevents law enforcement agencies from selling surplus firearms to the public by prohibiting those agencies from selling surplus firearms to anyone - including their own peace officers. A recent amendment permits a retired/retiring officer to purchase, but not active or reserve peace officers.

Status: Senate Appropriations Committee - oppose

AB 1486 (Jones-Sawyer) classifies tactical rifles as "military equipment" and requires a public meeting and local government vote for each purchase approval.

Status: Senate Floor - oppose

# **JAIL OPERATIONS**

SB 519 (Atkins) As introduced, it permits counties to remove jail operations from the jurisdiction of the county sheriff. As amended, it creates the independent Office of the Local Detention Monitor within the Board of State & Community Correction (BSCC) to be responsible for oversight of conditions in local detention facilities relating to in-custody deaths and the delivery of medical and mental health care. The Local Detention Monitor shall initiate an audit or review of policies, practices, and procedures of the local detention facility when asked by the Governor, the Senate Committee on Rules, the Speaker of the Assembly, or a board of supervisors by resolution.

Status: Assembly Appropriations Committee

AB 280 (Holden) bans solitary confinement for anyone under 26 or over 59 and for persons with a mental health condition or physical disability. Inmates who don't fit into those classifications are eligible for solitary, but for no longer than 15 consecutive days, without exception. Governor Newsom vetoed this same bill last year.

Status: Assembly Appropriations Committee - oppose

AB 958 (Santiago) creates a legal right for state and county inmates to have visitors and for visitors to meet with inmates, regardless of inmate behavior or even Departments that deny visits are subject to civil liability for violating this new right.

Status: Senate Appropriations Committee - oppose

# DEAD FOR THE YEAR - OPPOSED

AB 793 (Bonta) seeks to protect persons coming to California for abortion or transgender medical care by preventing their location information from being shared with the law enforcement agencies in their home state where leaving their state for such purposes may violate that state's laws. However, the bill prohibits reverse demand warrants in all cases. We asked for an amendment to limit the reverse demand restrictions in the bill to abortion and health care, thereby permitting the status quo for law enforcement's ability to continue to use this effective investigatory tool.

Status: Senate Judiciary Committee - oppose

AB 1463 (Lowenthal) severely restricts the ability of local law enforcement to access and retain automated license plate reader (ALPR) records for use in future criminal investigations.

Status: Senate Judiciary Committee - oppose

SB 252 (Gonzalez) requires CalPERS to divest from fossil fuels, potentially harming the pension fund. A number of amends were taken to prevent or mitigate financial losses that may be caused by the proposed divestment. Potential long term harm caused by banning investment in this sector would remain and any losses would be unrecoverable under this bill.

Status: Assembly PERS Committee - oppose

SB 226 (Alvarado-Gil) carrying a gun with fentanyl classified as a felony, similar to current law prohibiting carrying a firearm while in possession of heroin and other narcotics.

Status: Assembly Public Safety Committee- support

**SB 268 (Alvarado-Gil)** would classify rape of an unconscious woman a violent felony and eligible for longer sentencing, instead of early prison release.

Status: Assembly Public Safety Committee - support

# CA Supreme Court Finds No Immunity for Police Investigations

# **Immunity for Prosecutions Remains**

Government Claims Act (Gov't

Code § 821.6) provide law enforcement immunity for investigations?

Answer: No. Officers are not immune for harm claimed during the conduct of an investigation.

In *Leon v. County of Riverside*, a man was shot and killed in the driveway of a mobile home lot near his home. When the deputies arrived on scene to investigate, they heard additional gunshots. The deputies dragged the dead body behind a vehicle and attempted to revive him but were unsuccessful.

The movement in dragging the man behind the vehicle caused his pants to slide down to his ankles exposing his naked body. The man's body was left behind the vehicle for approximately eight hours while the deputies searched for the shooter and investigated the shooting. Ultimately, the deputies concluded that the shooter had killed himself. As a result, no charges were filed against anyone in this incident.

The man's wife sued for negligent infliction of emotional distress for the deputies' care in handling her husband's body arguing the deputies failed to exercise reasonable care when they left his naked body exposed and uncovered for eight hours, in an area where the general public could see.

The lower courts dismissed the case, finding the deputies and the County were immune from suit based on Government Code § 821.6 which provides immunity for law enforcement for injuries and claims caused by wrongful prosecution. The case was then appealed to the California Supreme Court.

The California Supreme Court was asked to decide whether Government Code § 821.6 provides law enforcement immunity from injuries and claims that stem from police investigations, not just prosecutions. On June 22, 2023, the Court ruled that the law does not provide immunity from conduct based on investigations. Rather, § 821.6 provides for immunity for injuries caused by the institution (meaning bringing charges) or prosecution of a case, not based on an investigation. In other words, Government Code § 821.6, does not provide any immunity from lawsuits where an investigation is conducted, but no charges are ever filed. An investigation refers to the process of gathering information, evidence and facts related to potential or alleged criminal activity.

# THE BOTTOM-LINE TAKEAWAY:

Lawsuits against officers for their conduct during an investigation can proceed (i.e., no immunity). But immunity from lawsuits still exists if officers cause harm during the process of bringing charges or prosecuting a case.

In other words, if an officer conducts an investigation but never files any charges, the officer can be sued. However, if the officer investigates a crime and charges are filed or the investigation leads to the prosecution of a crime, the officer may be granted immunity.






