





# Ninth Circuit Reverses Decision On Qualified Immunity

# **Grants QI For Use Of Lethal Force In Gym**

Smith v. Agdeppa, Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals, No. 20-56254, Filed 08/30/23.

#### BACKGROUND

n 2022, the Ninth Circuit court decided a civil rights case entitled *Smith v. City of Los Angeles* where an individual, (later identified as Dorsey) was shot and killed in a Hollywood gym.

Officers Agdeppa and Ramirez encountered Dorsey in a gym locker room after receiving a call that he assaulted a security guard and refused to leave. The officers ordered him to get dressed and leave the gym. Dorsey ignored the officers' commands and continued to walk back and forth across the locker room and dancing to music on his phone. As the officers continued to give him commands, Dorsey who was approximately 6'1" and 280 lbs, began taunting them. The officers attempted to handcuff Dorsey using a variety of control holds, but he resisted and was able to break the officers' grasp resulting in a violent struggle.

As a use of force ensued, both officers' Body Worn Video cameras were knocked from their uniforms; however, audio from the BWV footage confirms that both Officers continually shouted for Dorsey to stop resisting. Both Officers eventually deployed tasers, but neither were effective. Audio confirms that the struggle escalated after the taser deployments.

Officer Rodriguez can be heard repeatedly demanding that Dorsey turn around as her taser cycles multiple times. The Officers are heard shouting and groaning as the sounds of banging and thrashing increase. Officer Agdeppa recalled becoming disoriented after being struck in the face and knocked backward against a wall.

Once he recovered, Officer Agdeppa saw Dorsey straddling Officer Rodriguez pummeling her head and face as she laid on the floor. Officer Agdeppa feared Dorsey would kill his partner and resorted to lethal force by firing his service weapon killing Dorsey.

Although Agdeppa recalled giving warning prior to using lethal force, it was disputed at trial as no warning could be heard from the audio captured by either officers' BWV. As a result, the district court found that because Officer Agdeppa failed to warn Dorsey before using lethal force, he was not entitled to Qualified Immunity. Officer Agdeppa appealed. Michael P. Stone Legal Defense Trust General Counsel

# THE NINTH CIRCUIT 2022 DECISION

he Court concluded that a jury could find that the officer's use of deadly force was unreasonable under the circumstances. The Court confirmed that to determine whether an officer's use of force is objectively reasonable, you must look to the severity of the crime at issue, whether the suspect poses an immediate threat to the safety of the officers or others, and whether he is actively resisting arrest or attempting to evade arrest by flight. Additionally, the Court reiterated the deadly force is reasonable only if the officer has probable cause to believe the suspect poses an immediate and significant threat of death or serious physical injury to the officer or others.

Importantly, the Court found that, "whenever practicable" officers must give a warning that deadly force will be used prior to firing; specifically noting that a command to 'stop' is not sufficient.

Although the Court did not elaborate on when a use of force warning is 'practicable' under the circumstances, it did consider whether there was

sufficient time and opportunity to give a deadly force warning based upon the danger posed. While the court agreed that Dorsey presented a significant risk to the officers' safety, because it was determined that Officer Agdeppa failed to give notice that he was escalating to lethal force, he was not granted Qualified Immunity.

# THE NINTH CIRCUIT 2023 REVERSAL

Recently the Ninth Circuit revisited its 2022 decision that denied Officer Agdeppa Qualified Immunity and reversed. Without resolving factual disputes of the case, the court only addressed the question of whether there was clearly established precedent at the time of the incident that governed whether failing to warn of lethal force

### The court found that existing law at the time did not clearly establish when such a warning was practicable

under similar circumstances should result in a denial of Qualified Immunity.

The Ninth Circuit held that the rule that an officer must warn a suspect prior to using lethal force was not a "one-size-fits-all" rule that applies to any and all use of force encounters. Specifically, the court found that existing law at the time did not clearly establish when such a warning was practicable, what form the warning must take, or how specific it must be. Officers Agdeppa and Rodriguez repeatedly gave verbal commands, engaged in a lengthy violent struggle, attempted non-lethal force, and were still overpowered by Dorsey's attacks. As such, the court stated Officer Agdeppa was not required, "to call a 'time out' in the middle of an increasingly violent altercation" to give warning that lethal force could be, or was about to be, used. The Court granted him Qualified Immunity.

#### **BOTTOM LINE**

There still is no bright-line rule that states when a lethal force warning is practicable, what form the warning must take, or how specific it must be. The best recommendation is to **stay vocal by giving loud, clear commands and warnings as the encounter unfolds prior to the need for lethal force.**

# Another Strange End-Of-Year At The State Capital

ozens and dozens of bills were in-



troduced this year seeking to restrict the ability of law enforcement to maintain public safety. Other bills were written to reduce criminal penalties, provide benefits or increase protections for criminals.

Working closely with our colleagues at the other law enforcement associations, we've been pretty successful in either amending or defeating some of the most harmful bills. Moreover, a handful of pro-law enforcement and good public safety bills were approved and sent to the governor for his signature.

For the first time in decades, the legislature approved bills that increased felony penalties for egregious criminal acts. Of course, these same lawmakers also voted this session to reduce numerous criminal sentences and allow early parole for others.

It was also a big year for bills related to fentanyl. More than 40 fentanyl bills were introduced this year as legislators sought to take some action on this growing epidemic. Naloxone will be available throughout the state at amusement parks, stadiums, concert venues, etc. and in increased strengths. Fentanyl detection strips will become more accessible as part of an effort to prevent unintentional ingestion and poisoning. Legislators also increased punishment related to some drugs while decriminalizing others. Working closely with our colleagues at the other law enforcement associations, we've been pretty successful in either amending or defeating some of the most harmful bills.



#### DRUGS

AB 33 (Bains) creates the Fentanyl Misuse and Overdose Prevention Task Force to undertake specified duties relating to fentanyl abuse. *Sent to Governor* 

AB 461 (Ramos) requires information about fentanyl testing strips and availability on campuses of community colleges and California State Universities. *Sent to Governor* 

AB 701 (Villapudua) the existing weight enhancements that increase the penalty and fine for trafficking substances containing heroin and cocaine will now be applied to fentanyl. *Sent to Governor* 

AB 890 (Joe Patterson) requires a court to order a defendant who is granted probation for specified drug offenses involving fentanyl and other specified opiates to complete a fentanyl and synthetic opiate education program. *Sent to Governor*  SB 19 (Seyarto) requires the development of policy recommendations by the Fentanyl Misuse & Overdose Prevention Task Force (created via AB 33). Sent to Governor

SB 46 (Umberg) requires a person convicted of a drug offense and who is granted probation or sentenced under PC§ 1170(h) to successfully complete a controlled substance education or treatment program while on probation. Sent to Governor

SB 58 (Wiener) decriminalizes certain hallucinogenics including psilocybin, psilocyn, dimethyltryptamine (DMT), and mescaline. The so-called "magic mushroom" bill. Sent to Governor

SB 234 (Portantino) requires stadiums, concert venues, and amusement parks to maintain unexpired doses of an opioid antagonist on its premises and ensure that at least two employees are aware of the location. Sent to Governor

#### LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

#### Continued

SB 641 (Roth) allows increased formulations and dosage strengths of naloxone to better counteract fentanyl overdosing and poisonings. *Sent to Governor* 

#### **FIREARMS**

AB 303 (Davies) requires all investigative notes and reports collected by DOJ about individuals on the Armed Prohibited Persons database be shared with our local law enforcement agencies. *Signed by Governor* 

AB 355 (Alanis) corrects an oversight in current law by allowing peace officer cadets enrolled in basic training prescribed by the POST, or other certified training, to use a tactical (assault) rifle while engaged in firearms training. *Sent to Governor* 

AB 733 (M. Fong) prohibits law enforcement agencies from selling surplus

Making a false or fraudulent worker's compensation claim is a felony subject to up to 5 years in prison or a fine of up to \$50,000 or double the value of the fraud, whichever is greater, or by both imprisonment and fine.

firearms to members of the public. We were successful in helping to secure amendments to allow peace officers to purchase their service weapon. *Sent to Governor* 

AB 1486 (Jones-Sawyer) designates an assault weapon as not being a "standard issue service weapon" thereby requiring public hearings and disclosure of its use and specifications for purchasing approval by local elected politicians. The bill passed the Assembly, the Senate Public Safety & Appropriations

> Committees, but failed to secure enough votes on the Senate Floor. It may be taken up again next year. *Pending Assembly Floor - did not pass*

SB 2 (Portantino) prohibits persons with a ccw license, including off-duty, reserve peace officers, from carrying a concealed weapon in most public places. Active and retired peace officers, including most retired, reserve peace officers, are exempt from this law. A federal lawsuit alleging SB 2 is unconstitutional and in violation of the recent Bruen decision by the United States Supreme Court. *Sent to Governor* 

#### **PRO-PUBLIC SAFETY**

AB 88 (Sanchez) requires a court to hold a resentencing hearing if the victim notifies the prosecution of their request to be heard. *Sent to Governor* 

AB 791 (Ramos) prohibits a judge from granting postconviction bail to a convicted defendant subject to a sentence of life without parole. *Sent to Governor* 

SB 14 (Grove) designates sex trafficking of minors as a "serious" felony, making it a strike under California's Three Strikes law. *Sent to Governor* 

SB 75 (Roth) authorizes the creation of 26 additional judgeships, focusing on the current, insufficient numbers for the courts in San Bernardino and Riverside counties. *Sent to Governor* 

#### **PRO-CRIMINAL**

AB 994 (Jackson) requires law enforcement agencies to remove mugshots posted on their social media pages after 14 days in most instances. It also requires the agencies to only use the "preferred" (not legal or birth) name given by the suspect. *Sent to Governor* 

ACA 4 (Bryan) allows all state prison & jail inmates to vote in elections while incarcerated. It never gained enough votes for passage and remains on the Assembly Floor. *Pending Assembly Floor- did not pass* 

SB 50 (Bradford) prohibits law enforcement from conducting traffic stops for a busted headlight, taillight, expired registration, etc. The bill passed the Senate, the Assembly Public Safety & Appropriations Committees, but failed to secure enough votes on the Assembly Floor. It may be taken up again next year. *Pending Assembly Floor- did not pass* 

SB 94 (Cortese) allows parole for some first degree murderers convicted of special circumstances. The bill passed the Senate, the Assembly Public Safety & Appropriations Committees, but failed to secure enough votes to pass. It may be taken up again next year. *Pending Assembly Floor- did not pass* 

SB 749 (Smallwood-Cuevas) permanently removes the deadline for filing a petition for recall and resentencing for offenses reduced to a misdemeanor by Proposition 47. We joined the state sheriffs' association in opposing this bill. Unfortunately, there was some final night, end-of-session confusion about which law enforcement groups opposed this bill which allowed for its passage with the bare minimum votes required. *Sent to Governor* 

#### **RESTRICTIONS ON OFFICERS**

**SB 519 (Atkins)** makes some records relating to an investigation of a death conducted by a local detention facility available to the public and creates the position of Director of In-Custody Death Review within the Board of State and Community Corrections to review such investigations. The bill was significantly amended in the Assembly to maintain POBOR protections. *Sent to Governor* 

AB 280 (Holden) severely restricts use of solitary confinement in county jails and prisons - even when necessary for the safety of inmates and staff. *Pending Assembly Floor- did not pass* 

AB 505 (Ting) authorizes the Office of Youth and Community Restoration ombudsperson to access juvenile detention facilities and records at all times. The bill was significantly amended in the Senate to maintain BSCC authority, funding availability and POBOR protections. *Sent to Governor* 

In the coming weeks, Governor Newson will decide which of these bills to sign and which, if any, to veto. We'll provide an update on his actions next month.
